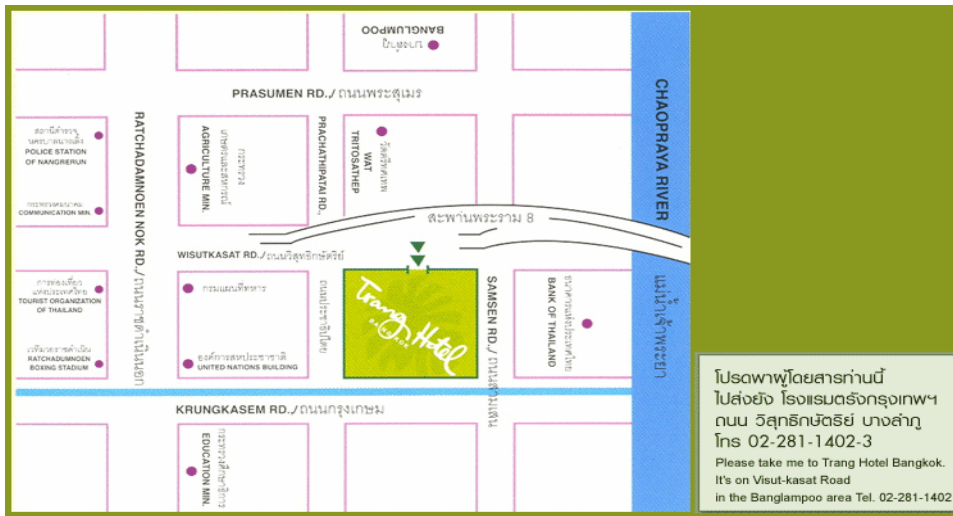
The poorest countries, least responsible for climate change, will suffer most from the impacts. Funds are urgently needed to support these countries in adapting to the worst impacts of climate change.

The industrialised countries agreed in Copenhagen and confirmed in Cancun to establish the Green Climate Fund to support the climate financing of developing countries of at least US \$100 billion in the year 2020. The UN Secretary-General's High-Level Advisory Group on Climate Change Financing (AGF) has identified international aviation and shipping as one important innovative source of climate financing to contribute to the fund (referred by some as bunker finance).

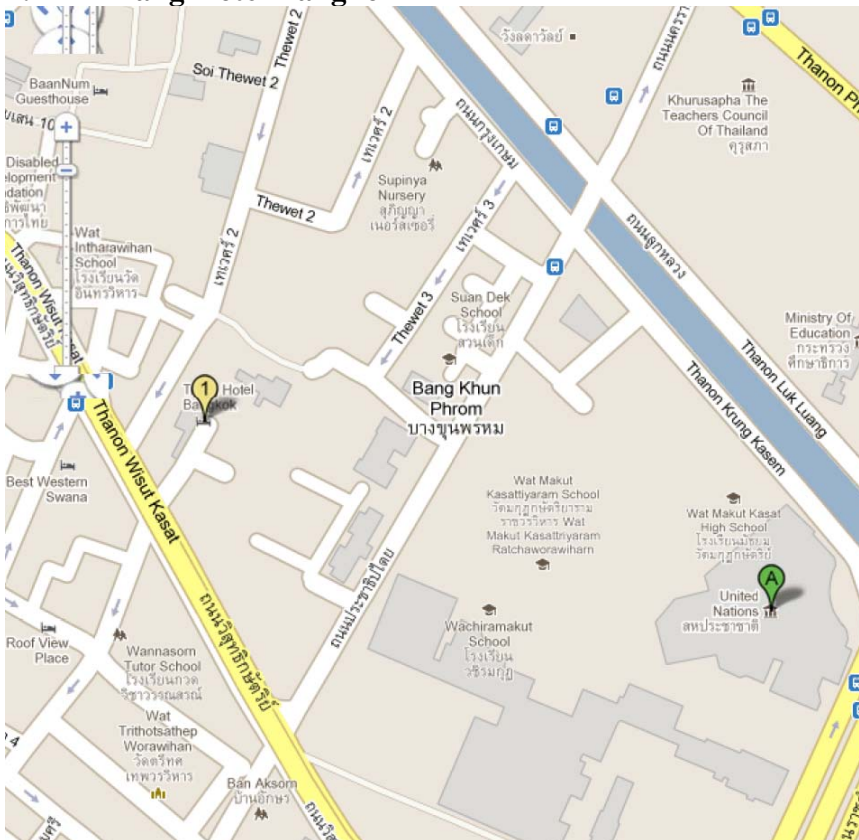
Bunker finance could be a valuable, reliable and equitable source of finance, potentially securing a double dividend by also unlocking mitigation packages in two sectors that have so far escaped greenhouse gas regulation. Developing countries have some concerns over global measures to deal with aviation and shipping, but these can be addressed by embracing the concept of 'no net incidence'. On the way to Durban, bunker finance measures will need strong support from developing countries. We are pleased to discuss these important issues at this workshop and appreciate that our panel is supported by representatives from the Global South who believe that such measures will benefit their countries.
